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OVERVIEW

The Fannett-Metal School District Cyber Academy for Tiger Students (**FM CATS**) is an educational learning environment designed to meet the needs of students who desire to pursue their education in a non-traditional format. The Fannett-Metal School District recognizes the value of distance learning yet continues to carry the belief that the interaction with professional educators truly extends learning to a higher level. This educational program offers a distance learning experience that includes a variety of interactions with highly qualified professional educators and guidance counselors.

Like the educational program of the Fannett-Metal School District's traditional "brick and mortar" system, the learning environment of **FM CATS** is based on the National Common Core Standards and Pennsylvania Academic Standards. This standards-aligned curriculum emphasizes the students' demonstration of mastering specific skills by engaging in an academic program that promotes proficiency in all curricular activities through distance learning. Students participating in **FM CATS** will demonstrate their proficiency in a variety of ways. This is necessary because students will range academically from those who have a sound skill base in all areas to those who have been identified as having learning deficits.

FM CATS strives to engage students in a highly motivational, student-centered educational program that relies on basic educational principles while utilizing the latest information and communications technology to promote student achievement in fostering higher-order thinking and problem-solving skills. Students have a chance to master essential content skills and to build a strong foundation to compete in the workforce of today and tomorrow.

GOALS

The Goals of the Fannett-Metal Cyber Academy (for) Tiger Students (FM CATS) are to:

- Offer to the students of the Fannett-Metal School District a non-traditional learning environment that is in line with the district's mission and vision statements.
- Provide students who desire a non-traditional learning environment with opportunities to acquire the education necessary to earn a diploma from the Fannett-Metal School District.
- Provide students who select **FM CATS** with balanced educational experiences, academic programs, and interactions with highly qualified professional educators.
- Establish for participating students individualized learning plans that are consistent with the Pennsylvania Academic Standards and graduation requirements of the Fannett-Metal School District.
- Provide students with a sense of ownership and responsibility for their academics.

ADMISSION

Students who apply to attend the **Fannett-Metal Cyber Academy (for) Tiger Students (FM CATS)** will have their applications reviewed by **FM CATS** Coordinators in consultation with the building-level guidance counselor. It will be the responsibility of the coordinators to determine student eligibility in conjunction with building-level guidance counselor to determine admittance and/or removal from the program. Students who are admitted to **FM CATS** must enroll for at least one nine-week marking period unless otherwise determined by the building administrator and guidance counselor. The building administrator and guidance counselor will also review other related student or person with parental consent educational requests upon enrollment. Enrollment in **FM CATS** will be limited to the first ten (10) school days of the first, second, and third marking periods. Seniors may not enroll in **FM CATS** the second semester of their senior year without approval by the Superintendent. Any enrollment exceptions shall be reviewed and approval will be considered by the Superintendent.

REGISTRATION/ORIENTATION

When registering with the **Fannett-Metal Cyber Academy (for) Tiger Students (FM CATS)**, students and person with parental consent will meet with the **FM CATS** administrator, building-level guidance counselor, and other essential staff who will work to determine what courses each student will take. It will be at this time that courses will be scheduled, any passwords and other directions will be given, and guidance on how to "trouble shoot" for technical issues will be shown.

STUDENT EXPECTATIONS

Your participation in **FM CATS** requires you to be organized, motivated and willing to assume responsibility for your education. Failure to adhere to any of the following requirements may contribute to your removal from **FM CATS**.

Virtual Academy students must:

1. Complete 4 hours of online work for 5 days per week
2. Complete a prescribed amount of work for each subject area
3. Access individual school email account daily
4. Make contact with the appropriate district staff when support is needed
5. Complete activities by established deadlines
6. Complete and submit their own work
7. Work in the order in which the assignments are posted. (Students may accelerate course completion with the approval the building administrator and guidance counselor.)

EXPECTATIONS FOR PERSON WITH PARENTAL CONSENT, INVOLVEMENT, AND RESPONSIBILITIES

Student success is greatly impacted by parental involvement. During orientation, the person with parental consent will be shown how to monitor their child's progress. Parents are requested to make contact with the building-level guidance counselor at least once a month. You can contact your guidance counselor via email, telephone, or in person.

- Establish parameters for completing assignments (Time, Environment, Goals, Pacing)
- Show interest in student's education and progress
- Monitor progress

ATTENDANCE

We understand that students work at different paces based on their academic ability. It is *recommended* that students spend a minimum of one hour on each subject per day, depending on their course load. With flexible scheduling, this may be stretched over 7 days. **FM CATS** building administrator and guidance counselor will review student login time on a regular basis. Self-reflection is an integral component of the monitoring process. Students will be challenged to consider the following:

1. Pacing: Are you at pace, behind or ahead? Adjust your online time accordingly.
2. Attendance: Are you working every day? Adjust your schedule to meet this goal.
3. Performance: Are you passing or performing at the expected level? If need be, adjust to improve performance.

Students who fail to meet the requirements set forth in **FM CATS** can be dismissed from the program. Attendance is taken to ensure that students are working online. Students must attend school every day (see school calendar). Due to the nature of the cyber school model, instructional time and progress can be entered on any day (e.g. weekends, holidays, etc.) and at any time, 24 hours a day - seven days a week. Students are expected to log into each scheduled course in the online system each scheduled school calendar day. If attendance is not recorded on a school day as listed on the school calendar, the student is marked as absent. If, a student fails to log into his/her account for **three** consecutive days, **FM CATS** administrator and/or building-level guidance counselor will be in contact with both the student and parent (via email, mail, or phone call). The district will treat the three consecutive absences in the same manner as students are who attend the regular "brick and mortar" school.

Daily reports can be generated using the instructional software and district monitoring tools to ensure that the student is "present" and working for the minimum amount of time. Students who are absent from online school work must submit a written excuse (can be emailed or delivered) by the person with parental consent to the respective building secretary within three (3) days of the absence. In the case of extended illness, the student should communicate with the **FM CATS** building administrator and guidance counselor to complete all work missed in a reasonable length of time. Failure to follow this policy may result in dismissal from the **FM CATS** program.

After five (5) or more days absent within the first forty-five (45) days of school during the school year, a letter of concern will be mailed to the person with parental consent regarding the excessive absence. Ten (10) or more days absent after the forty-fifth (45) day of school during the school year, a letter of concern will be mailed to the person with parental consent indicating that subsequent absences must be verified by a written excuse from a licensed physician.

Children whose names are on the active membership roll, who are at any time in the school term absent from school for ten consecutive school days, may thereafter be removed from the **FM CATS** active roll unless the district has been provided with evidence that the absence may be legally excused or compulsory attendance prosecution has been or is being pursued.

PROGRESS MONITORING

Students must attend a mandatory meeting with the **FM CATS** administrator and building-level guidance counselor on a bi-weekly basis, usually in a face-to-face setting; however, other arrangements will be made available if needed. The **FM CATS** building-level guidance counselor will email a bi-weekly progress report to the student and the designated person with parental consent. Students and those with parental consent can monitor academic progress via the Edmentum Portal.

Prior to the end of each nine week grading period, the guidance counselor and building principal will review the academic performance of the student. Upon completion of this review, it will be determined whether the student will continue in the **FM CATS** program. Persons with parental consent may be requested to come to the school to participate in this process. All policies and procedures contained in this document will be reviewed. Please note that if a student is not meeting expectations, he/she may be removed prior to the end of the marking period.

CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

CLUBS / ACTIVITIES / ORGANIZATIONS / CO-CURRICULAR

As a member of **FM CATS**, students are eligible and are strongly encouraged to join in and participate with all clubs, organizations and co-curricular activities offered by the District. Students will need to meet eligibility requirements.

ATTENDANCE AT DANCES/PROM/ASSEMBLIES

Students enrolled in **FM CATS** are permitted and encouraged to attend all school activities and functions. Please refer to the Fannett-Metal Student Handbook for eligibility requirements and guidelines.

SCHOLASTIC ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENT FOR EXTRA-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

FM CATS secondary students participating in extra-curricular activities before public audiences or inter-scholastically (i.e. sports, plays, band, and academic competitions) will lose their eligibility if they are failing two courses weekly. Eligibility shall be cumulative from the beginning of a grading period, shall be reported on a weekly basis and shall be filed in the Principal's office. In cases where a student's cumulative work from the beginning of the grading period does not, as of each Monday of the activity, meet the standards provided for in this section, he/she shall be ineligible immediately following that Monday through Sunday of the following week. If a student failed any *two* classes during the previous grading period, the student will be ineligible for the first *fifteen days* of the next grading period. The student may practice during this fifteen-day period but the student cannot participate in any competition.

NOTIFICATION OF INTENT TO DESTROY IRRELEVANT EDUCATIONAL RECORDS

FM CATS maintains educational records for students enrolled in the District. The records are reviewed at transition times as designated in school code. Those times when the student moves from elementary to middle school, when the student moves from middle school to high school, at high school graduation, and five years after the student graduates from high school. Information that is no longer relevant or required by Law to be maintained will be purged from the student's file. Only transcript information is retained after graduation. The educational records of your child will be held for 45 days following the transition times identified above. During that time, you have the right to inspect, review, or copy at your expense any of the information. In order for the person with parental consent or eligible student to inspect, review, or copy the education records, a written request must be made to Fannett-Metal School District, 14823 Path Valley Road, Willow Hill, PA 17271.

NETWORK ACCEPTABLE USE POLICY

- Information available through the Internet may be protected by copyrights or trademarks. Transmission of copyrighted or pornographic material in violation of any federal or state regulation is prohibited.
- Computer users should be aware that the Internet contains offensive material.
- The Internet is a vast worldwide network with very few limitations or restrictions. Not all sources on the Internet provide accurate, complete, or current information. The Fannett-Metal School District is not responsible for any information obtained on the Internet.
- Any malicious attempt to harm or destroy data is prohibited. This includes the uploading or creating of computer viruses. Hardware or software may not be modified or destroyed. Users may not change settings or load personal programs onto any of the District's computers without authorization from a sponsoring teacher or the technology support staff.
- Students may not use the Internet for any commercial or for-profit purposes related to the online educational materials provided by the school district.
- Students may not include pictures, descriptions, or any other such references to school employees or other students on student-created web sites without signed permission from employee or student. Violation of this provision will result in immediate termination of **FM CATS** privileges, administration of appropriate school discipline, and possible referral to local police authorities.
- It is a felony offense in the state of Pennsylvania "to display or cause to display any explicit sexual material ... on any ... viewing screen in such manner that the display is visible ... in any establishment where minors, as part of the general public, may be exposed to view all or any part of such materials." (Title 18 PA Crime Code-Sect. 5903) The FMSD Acceptable Use Policy in its entirety is available on the district's website.

HEALTH RECORDS

Students enrolled in **FM CATS** are required to acquire health screenings and maintain school health records the same as the students in each grade level within the "brick and mortar." This is in accordance with regulations set forth by the Pennsylvania Departments of Health and Education. This means that every student in each grade must receive a height, weight, Body Mass Index (BMI), and vision screening each year of school. These screenings will take place in the Nurse's Suite at the secondary school and may be arranged through the nurse's office (Teresa Barnish (717) 349-3052, barnisht@fmtigers.org). The school nurse will then maintain these records.

In addition, other health services are required in the following grade levels:

Kindergarten or 1st grade: Medical and Dental Examination

3rd grade: Dental Examination

6th grade: Medical Examination and Scoliosis Test

7th grade: Hearing Test, Scoliosis Test, and Dental Examination

11th grade: Medical Examination and Hearing Test

Each of these examinations can be conducted by school health officials when offered to traditional students in those grade levels at no cost or person with parental consent can elect to have their own private family physician/dentist perform these examinations at a cost to the families. If the latter is the case, the person with parental consent must provide proof to the school district of these exams. Forms for this purpose can be obtained from the school nurse or website. The school district is also obligated to ensure that students have the proper immunizations and can request these records from the person with parental consent at any time. If you have any questions about required immunizations, please contact your family physician or the school nurse.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

The current graduation requirement is 27 credits. Curricular graduation requirements are:

Additional graduation requirements:

1. State Assessments

- All students must participate in all available state assessments for graduation.

2. Graduation Project

- In order to help students to be prepared for their next steps in life, all students graduating from the Fannett-Metal School District must complete a culminating project. This project will encompass many diverse options and will conclude with an exit interview. The foundation of this project is embedded in career exploration, which will prepare the student to pursue future endeavors.

3. Career Portfolio

- Students must complete a Career Portfolio as outlined in the graduation project.

Student are advised to monitor their academic progress continually to be sure that graduation requirements are met.

By the conclusion of the senior year, students must complete community service hours totaling twenty (20) hours for post-secondary or twenty-seven (27) hours for those not pursuing post-secondary education. Students must present verification that they have done something for our community. Completing all the hours at once may not be considered as adequate.

Class rank will only be included during the senior year for transcript purposes. Otherwise, it will not be published prior to the senior year. Rank will be determined via the student information management system. The system takes into account the 4.0/5.0 grading scales. 5.0 classes include any early-to-college or advanced placement courses.
