Dear Kindergarten Parents,

We are continuing the recognition of the letters, letter sounds, and sight words in language arts.

Language Art Activities with Special Emphasis on:

- Identify and create rhyming words
- Identify colors
- Practice printing letters and popcorn words
- Practice reading popcorn words
- Introduce different book genres (informational text, realistic fiction, and fiction)
- Predict outcomes
- Listen for the main idea of a story
- Identifying characters
- Recalling details
- Retelling the sequence of events
- Discriminate beginning sounds and letters
- Blending and Segmenting sounds in words
- Grammar Focus: action verbs, sensory words, adjectives (for color, numbers, size, and shapes), and reviewing nouns (person, place, animal, or thing)
- Vocabulary Focus: classify and categorizing words, antonyms (opposites), and synonyms (words that mean the same)
- Develop reading strategies

Math Readiness:

- Continue recognizing patterns by color, shape, and size
- Continue to use concrete objects to understand same as, equal, more, fewer, more than, less than, before, after
- Study the value of numbers to 10
- Represent and compare numbers to 10
- Categorize and classify by shapes, colors, size, and kind
- Start addition and subtraction with numbers up to five
- Count to 50 and above
- Practice writing numbers 1-20
- Practice number recognition 1-20

- Continue the unit of study on Trees
 - Start a unit on Fabric
