Upon receipt of all certifications, Ms. Wilt will be hired at Step 1 of the Bachelor's Certification at a pro-rated salary of \$42,850 for the 2021-2022 school year. Roll call vote – all ayes.

Moved by Catherine Adams and seconded by Jason Goshorn to rehire Patricia Smith as a Part-time Cafeteria Worker at a rate of \$9.25 per hour. Roll call vote – all ayes.
