The Fannett-Metal School Board held their regular meeting on Tuesday, September 13, 2022, at 7:00 p.m. in the High School Library. Members present were Sue Rosenberry, President; Bonnie Cornelious, Vice-President; Catherine Adams, Shelly Boggs, Stacy Coffman, Jason Goshorn, Amanda Guyer, Walter Hoffmann (arrived 7:02 p.m.), and Chad McClure. There were no members absent. Also present were Dr. Tara Will, Superintendent; Daniel Simpson, Business Manager; Teresa Black, Director of Special Education and Student Support Services; Todd Best, Middle/High School Principal; Elliott Sulcove, Solicitor and Sandra Bloom, Board Secretary. Visitors present were Ruth Mitchell, Michelle Moore, and Coral McMath.

Administrative Reports

Dr. Tara Will said since Mrs. Shoemaker was absent, Mrs. Black could do her report first.

Mrs. Teresa Black said SEL (Social Emotional Learning) curriculum is being presented by the counselors this evening. We would like to pilot Wayfinder this year in their classes and then expand it as needed moving forward. We are still in need of a part-time classroom aide if anyone knows of someone. Mrs. Black will be attending a mandatory training on Act 16 tomorrow in Harrisburg and there have been a lot of parents, students and teacher meetings taking place to provide the best support to our students.

Mr. Todd Best said a special thank you to Amanda Jones who has done a great job filling in for Family Consumer Science/Physical Education/Health and a special thank you to Greg Best for helping to serve middle school lunches. The senior class is preparing an agenda and estimate for a trip to Williamsburg and Homecoming will start with a triple header against McConnellsburg on October 14, 2022, with Jr. High, Girls and Boys soccer and the homecoming dance on October 15, 2022. The concrete for the dugout is scheduled to arrive on Thursday at 10:30 a.m. Mr. Best also mentioned changes needed to the search policy and how the board wanted him to proceed due to a student refusing to be wanted & wanted patted down instead. The student left the building before the situation was resolved. The air conditioning is on at a temperature of 72-74 degrees.

Dr. Tara Will said FOFMA met at the end of August and was given a wish list of needs that included supplies for several sports teams along with a request to fund the locker room floors at the high school. They are going to look at grant opportunities to see if this is an avenue worth exploring. Dr. Will said the Chambersburg Pennsylvania State Police notified the district that they will be on site Tuesday, September 20, 2022, in the morning as part of their support for Franklin County school safety. They will also be here on Wednesday, September 21, 2022, to conduct seatbelt checks. We appreciate the visibility they have shown thus far this year. Dr. Will and Mr. Simpson successfully completed and submitted the Pennsylvania Commission on Crime and Delinquency (PCCD) grant the end of August. There were two parts to the grant, one for physical safety and one for mental health. The total amount submitted was approximately \$200,000. We received notice that applications were being reviewed but not to spend any money until final approval is received. The school counselors will be presenting the SEL (Social Emotional Learning) Curriculum.

Mrs. Michelle Moore and Mrs. Coral McMath did a presentation on Wayfinder K-12 Curriculum. The school counseling program is to provide comprehensive services to all students to address social-emotional, academic, and career goals. They supply these services by administering small group counseling, individual counseling, classroom guidance, and consultation and referrals and assessment coordination. The Wayfinder K-12 Curriculum would meet all these services and they would be able to expand on the curriculum in the years to come.
